

1. Annual General Meeting 2019



5. INDUSTRIAL VISIT TO KMML CHAVARA

The IEEE SB CEK in association with Industry Applications Society conducted a visit to the Kerala Minerals and Metals Ltd. one of India's prestigious public sector organizations operating under Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) and Defense Research Development Organization (DRDO).

The student members including 2 faculty members visited the Kerala Minerals and Metals Ltd. Chavara on 25th March 2019. The unit is focusing on Titanium dioxide mining, separation of synthetic rutile and pigment separation production plant.

At first we were taken by an employee and gave a brief explanation about pigment production plant and also made all of us aware of safety measures that need to be followed. Later we were guided by another staff and he gave explanations about functioning of

- 1. Chlorination.
- 2. Oxidation.
- 3. Slurry formation.
- 4. Filtering/washing.
- 5. Pigment surface treatment and finishing.

And the session concluded with a meal.

Then we were taken to mineral separation plant by Mr. Sudharshan, production manager of Mineral Separation Plant. Explained the plant's functioning. There we saw the mineral-rich sand taken from captive beaches for separation of ilmenite, rutile, monazite, sillimanite. MS unit employs gravitational, magnetic and high-tension electrostatic technique for separation of minerals from the sand. At last students expressed their thanks to officials for the tremendous opportunity given. The visit contributed lots and lots of beneficial informative about advanced mining technologies and all of the information considered to be useful for recruitment opportunities for such industries and also help us to acquire theoretical and practical knowledge.

6. IEEE COUNSELLING DESK 2019

IEEE IAS Student Branch Chapter exclusively organized a counselling desk for the first year students. The counselling desk was open to the first-year students on the 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th of July from 9.00am to 4.00pm. It was held at the administrative block, near college office. It was aimed to furnish an awareness on IEEE and its benefits to student members. After their admission procedures, the students were called to the counselling desk and the volunteers at the desk gave an overview on IEEE and it's, it's benefits to student members, our student branch and our achievements. Four student volunteers were present at the desk every day to counsel the students.

Day 1 (09/07/2019)

The desk was opened at 9.00am. 7 students appeared at the desk, out of which 1 paid the complete registration fee (Rs. 2600) and 1 gave a temporary registration fee of Rs. 300.

Day 2 (10/07/2019)

A total of 20 students appeared on the second day, out of which 1 gave the full payment and 9 registered temporarily. Most of the students seemed interested and assured to register after the orientation class.

Day 3 (11/07/2019)

33 students appeared on the 3rd day, out of which 8 registered temporarily. Around 20 minutes of counselling was given to each student to ensure that they get an overview on IEEE and its benefits.

Day 4 (12/07/2019)

14 students appeared at the desk on the final day of counselling. 2 of them paid the full payment and 3 enrolled for the temporary registration.

The IEEE counselling desk 2019 witnessed an overall positive response from the students as most of them seemed interested and assured to registered after the official orientation class. The volunteers provided a brief but a solid overview on IEEE and its activities within the given short time. Out of the 74 students appeared at the desk, 25 either paid the full amount or enrolled the temporary registration.

24/08/2019



They shared the procedures and processes that they follow in producing their products. Then was a session by prof. Deepa AK, secretary of WIE, Kerala session, on 'how to write a technical paper'. She discussed everything one should focus while writing a technical paper as pursuing engineers, explaining the important points one should heed. Er. Staji Wilson, Young Professional IEEE Kerala Section handled an interactive session on 'IEEE opportunities and leadership'. The forenoon session of the day was a young professionals interaction session. Er. Anish M S, an active IEEE Power and Energy Society Young Professional, handled the first session on "higher education and career opportunities". He talked

about the possibilities in higher education in India and abroad and the career options that follows. The session was followed by another YP interaction session by Er. Shyam Pradeep Alil, entrepreneur and YP volunteer, IEEE Kerala Chapter, on "entrepreneurship". He shared his experience on growing from a student to an entrepreneur at a young age. His session was an inspiration on how to establish an idea.
